What is NYLT White Stag?

National Youth Leadership Training is an exciting, action-packed program designed to provide youth members of the Boy Scouts of America with leadership skills and experience they can use in their home troops and in other situations demanding leadership of self and others.

Course Overview:

The NYLT course centers around the concepts of what a leader must **BE**, what he must **KNOW**, and what he must **DO**. The key elements are then taught with a clear focus on **HOW TO**. The skills come alive during the week as the patrol goes on a *Quest for the Meaning of Leadership*.

NYLT is a six-day course, patterned after a month in the life of a troop. Content is delivered in a troop and patrol outdoor setting with an emphasis on immediate application of learning in a fun environment.

The NYLT course integrates the best of modern leadership theory with the traditional strengths of the Scouting experience. Through activities, presentations, challenges, discussions, and audio-visual support, NYLT participants will be engaged in a unified approach to leadership that will give them the skills and confidence to lead well. Through a wide range of activities, events, games, and adventures, NYLT participants will work and play together as they put into action the best that Scouting has to offer.

The Stages of Team Development:

During an NYLT course, patrol members find themselves going through the stages of team development. Their challenges heighten the team development process, enabling them to use their awareness of the stages to build a highly effective team that can reach its full potential. Along the way they also enjoy the Scouting fellowship and fun that are key components of the patrol method

Vision, Goals and Planning:

NYLT participants discover that leading themselves and leading others requires a vision—a picture of future success. Each patrol will develop a team vision for the course, and each individual will prepare his own vision. A constant refrain of NYLT is "If you can see it, you can be it." Through presentations and positive experiences in goal setting, planning, and problem solving, participants learn how to set a clear course toward realizing their team and individual visions, and then how to put themselves in the center of those pictures of future success.

The Scout Oath and Law:

Every NYLT course operates according to the principles of the Scout Oath and Law. Each participant and staff member is welcomed, appreciated, and valued. There is no room for hazing or for any activities that do not add to a positive learning experience for everyone.

Have Fun:

Leadership, fun, challenge, adventure—NYLT offers all of those and much more. The NYLT program is the centerpiece of this council's youth training opportunities, providing local troops with outstanding youth leaders and giving those Scouts the tools and leadership ideals that will serve them well in whatever they do.

Who should attend White Stag NYLT?

Any scout who is currently holding a key leadership role in their home troop or the Scoutmaster feels has the potential to hold a key leadership position in the future. Along with the Scoutmaster's approval the scout must be 13 years old as of the first day of course and hold the rank of First Class Scout.

What is the involvement of the Home Troop Scoutmaster?

White Stag NYLT is intended to strengthen the relationship between the youth leader and Scoutmaster. The Scoutmaster is highly encouraged to have a pre-course and post-course conference with the scout to discuss their vision and goals for future success of their home troop.

When and where is it held?

White Stag NYLT is held twice a year. The first session is from June 12-18, 2011. The second session is from July 17-23, 2011. Each session is held at Camp Red Wing located at 5757 East Inlow Springs Road Muncie, IN 47302.

What is the cost of the program?

Fees for the course are \$165.00 per scout and include all food and materials. Early Bird fees for the course are \$150.00 if paid 30 days prior to the start of attended session.

June session early bird cutoff is May 12, 2011
July session early bird cutoff is June 17, 2011

A deposit of \$25.00 per scout should accompany the reservation form to hold a spot. The balance of payment is due by the dates above to receive the early bird fee otherwise the \$165 will be due prior to the course. Scouts may wish to bring a small amount of spending money for the White Stag NYLT trading post.

The trading post will only be open on the first and last day of course.
